Dear Parents and Carers

Our Year One students had a terrific day at the Irukandji Sharks and Rays excursion last week. Children were encouraged to build connections to marine animals which teaches them to understand the natural world and engages them in conservation initiatives such as Take 3 for the Sea.

Teachers last week participated in professional learning and lesson planning for term two which included preparing students in Years Three and Five for participation in the National Assessment Program Literacy And Numeracy (NAPLAN), in May. Whilst this is not a general knowledge test that children can study for, it is certainly beneficial if they are au fait with mathematics 'friends of ten' and times tables.

I have asked all classroom teachers to make contact with as many of their parents as possible.

New aluminium seating has been ordered for the Years One and Two eating areas which will mean all students will have new, more suitable seating that can be easily cleaned and maintained. It also enhances the appearance of our playground and encourages everyone in the school community to take pride in our wonderful school.

Last Saturday, trees were due to be removed from the quadrangle outside the Years Five and Six classrooms but rain prevented this. A number of large branches have fallen from the trees rendering them unsafe so we will now plant a new garden using more suitable shrubs and trees. I'm thrilled with our vegetable gardens which are looking great since the recent working bee.

Our Hair Raising Day is fast approaching and we look forward to making a significant donation to Kids With Cancer through students having their hair colour sprayed or cut. Leila Travers initiated this project and she will have 30cm of hair cut so it can be donated towards making a hair piece. Mr Boutland has also offered to have his hair cut off.

Please watch for Easter raffle tickets which will be drawn at the Easter Hat Parade. Students in Years K – 3 will participate in the parade, starting at 1.35pm on the last day of term and I've heard a whisper that the Easter Bunny may even make an appearance.

Recycle and win Community Garden Competition.

We are participating in this year's TerraCycle competitions and need your help.

Why are we doing this?
