Deepwater Plaza partners with Mary Mac's Place to help feed those in need.

Deepwater Plaza will partner with well-known local community organisation Mary Mac's Place Woy Woy, in a month-long campaign and donation drive to support those in the local community experiencing food insecurity and homelessness.

Mary Mac's Place serve over 500 meals a week from Monday to Friday to those most in need in our community, relying 100% on donations to continue to provide this vital service.

In the last 12 months, 18% of the Australian population have run out of food and were unable to purchase more*. Organisations such as Mary Mac's Place are critical to the local community and they rely heavily on the support of individuals and local businesses.

From 4-31 August, Deepwater Plaza shoppers can donate food, toiletries and laundry items at the Donation Hub opposite Coles. Donated items will be given directly to Mary Mac's Place at the end of the month.

"Deepwater Plaza has set up a dedicated shopfront for this activity, located opposite Coles Supermarket, to encourage shoppers to grab one extra item when they purchase their groceries, and donate this item to our fundraising efforts," said Marcelle Proper, Centre Manager, Deepwater Plaza.

Additionally, from 12-24 August, shoppers can purchase a \$2 or \$5 plate and place their plate on the donation wall to show their support.

"We're hoping through this activity we'll be able to raise awareness of the stark reality that is the ever-increasing need for food relief. The plates will be a visible and striking way to highlight the generosity of our local community," added Marcelle.

Deepwater Plaza will match each plate donated to a maximum of \$2,500.

"Mary Mac's is open to anyone needing a helping hand. We rely solely on donations and would love to see the local community get behind this wonderful initiative. The community's generosity will ensure we can keep providing meals and other important services to those that need it the most on the Peninsula," said Catherine Pantehis, Coordinator Homeless Services, Catholic Care.
